From the West: Take I-85 North to GA 316 east. Do not exit on the US 78E Business Athens-Monroe exit. Continue on GA 316 for 4.5 additional miles to Loop 10 Inner. (Home Depot will be within sight on the right.) Turn right onto Loop 10 Inner and travel to the Lexington Rd./Oconee St. (exit 8), Take US Highway 78 West into downtown Athens. At the traffic light at Oconee, Broad, and Thomas Streets (this will be a five way intersection) take a sharp right onto E. Broad Street. The orange and green building in the triangle will be on your right; travel one block; turn left on Foundry Street. The entrance to the parking deck will be on your left.

From the East: Take US Highway 78 West into downtown Athens. At the traffic light at Oconee, Broad, and Thomas

Streets (this will be a five way intersection) take a sharp right onto E. Broad Street. The orange and green building in the triangle will be on your right; travel one block; turn left on Foundry Street. The entrance to the parking deck will be on your left.

From the North: Take US Highway 441 South into Athens. Continue straight at the intersection of US 441 and GA Loop 10. The street name will become ML King Jr. Parkway. Follow MLK Pky. Until you get to North Avenue. Turn right onto North Avenue. Stay to the left. At the light at Thomas and Dougherty the Athens Welcome Center will be on your right. Go one block on Thomas, turn left onto Strong Street. Travel to Foundry Street turn right. The parking deck will be ahead on your left.

From the South: Take US 441, US 129, GA 15 North around Watkinsville and into Athens. After the traffic light at White Oak cross 2 bridges (sign for Clarke County Line and directional sign to UGA), turn right onto GA 10/US 441 US 129/GA 15. Exit at Lexington Rd./Oconee St. (exit 8), Take US Highway 78 West into downtown Athens. At the traffic light at Oconee, Broad, and Thomas Streets (this will be a five way intersection) take a sharp right onto E. Broad Street. The orange and green building in the triangle will be on your right; travel one block; turn left on Foundry Street. The entrance to the parking deck will be on your left.

Meet your GAA Board of Director candidates

Enclosed in this newsletter, you will find a ballot for the 2014-16 Georgia Angus Association (GAA) Board of Directors election. GAA members have the opportunity to vote for their directors by returning the enclosed ballot in the ballot envelope by January 21. Here is a brief bio on each candidate.

Clay Bussell, Social Circle, is a native of Washington County, Ga.. He and his wife Dana have two sons, Cole (9) and Tucker (6). Clay has been around livestock his whole life but began a focus on Angus cattle in 2007. In his early years, Clay exhibited cattle on a local, state and national level. He was employed by Shoulderbone Plantation in White Plains from 2006-2010. In 2011, Clay and his family were given the opportunity to join the Bricton Farm operation where they hold an annual bull sale in January and annual female sale in April. Clay is a member of the Newton County Young Farmers as well as an officer for the Piedmont Cattle Association.



Fred Gretsches, Lexington, is married to wife and partner Anne Gretsches for 25 years. They have four kids - Will 23, Zach 21, Abbey 17, and Jaden 13. Fred has been in the cattle business for 25 years and has been an Angus breeder since 2005. Fred is a past president of the Oglethorpe County Cattlemen's, a current member of both Madison and Oglethorpe chapters, participates in the Angus AHIR program, and has been involved in junior activities through Abbey and Jaden. Fred and Anne have both gone to Lead conferences with Abbey. Fred is also an NCBA member and an independent contractor with Genex. Fred has a degree in Ag Economics from UGA, and participates in the UGA bull tests, herd programs, and beef challenge. Fred is a member of Team National, and board member for his family foundation music business.



Jason Johns, Rockmart, was born and raised on his family's beef cattle farm in Gordon County, Ga. He is the fourth generation of beef cattle farmers in his family. The family has owned the same property for over 100 hundred years.



He grew up as a 4-H member active in the livestock showing projects, Livestock Judging and Beef Quiz Bowls. Since graduating, he has been a 4-H and FFA volunteer involved in breeding, feeding, clipping, training and fitting many numerous champions on local, state and national levels. He bought his first farm at the age of 21, owning both Angus and commercial cattle. Since 2006, he has been the manager of Poe Farms, Dallas, Ga. Poe Farms has both Commercial and Angus Herds. Poe Farms operates an intensive AI and Embryo Transfer program under Jason's leadership.

Smitty Lamb, Tifton, was raised on a small farm near Wadley. He obtained his BS and Master's degrees in animal science from the University of Georgia in 1991 and 1993, respectively, where he was a member of the livestock, meats and horse judging teams and coached the meats judging team while in graduate school. Since 1998, Smitty has worked as a cotton merchant. He is currently the Memphis-East Sourcing leader for Glencore, Ltd's cotton division. Smitty has also held positions as a County Extension Agent, and Agricultural Education. In 1997, Smitty and Clint Smith, business partner and cousin, established Ogeechee Farms in Wadley. Ogeechee uses extensive AI and ET technology focusing on the breeding and development of Angus bulls that exceed for traits of merit and add value to commercial operations. Smitty and his wife, SuzAnne, have two children, Tatum and Beau Brinson. He is an active member of Tifton's First United Methodist Church. Smitty is also a graduate of the 2008 class of the Georgia Agri-Leaders Forum Foundation and serves on the Board of American Cotton Shippers Association.



John Lovin, Lexington, has a long career in the agricultural industry. John and his wife have raised chickens for 30+ years and also run Genflo Angus which consists of 30 head of Angus cattle and 150 commercial cows. He is a member and director of the Oglethorpe Cattlemen's Association, member of the Oglethorpe FFA Alumni and has served on the Gwinnett County Fair Board of Directors for 27 years. They have four children and six grandchildren.

Mike McCravy, Bowdon, and his wife Christy, own and operate MM Cattle Co. They have both registered and commercial Angus cattle. Producing registered bulls for the commercial cowman and providing groups of commercial cows and heifers are the focus of the program along with a few elite show heifer prospects each year. A full time cattleman, Mike is very involved in the industry. He came up through the junior program where he was active in both the GJAA and the state 4-H programs, where he still supports and promotes both today. He has been a member of the American Angus Assoc., the Georgia Angus Assoc., and the Georgia Cattleman's Assoc. since the age of 21 in 1980. Serving on the GAA board for several terms, he is the current President, has been vice president and served

on different committees including the Beef Expo Sale. He was a member of the GCA board for 6 years, moving through the ranks to President in 2008. He is a member of NCBA and has served on committees there. Active in local organizations, he has been a board member and President of both the Carroll and Heard County Cattlemen's Associations and the Carroll Co. Young Farmer's, along with being a past board member of the County Farm Bureau, the GCCPA, and several different advisory councils.

Andrew McPeake, PhD, Arnoldsville, along with his father Dr. Charles McPeake, own and operate CAM Ranches, a 100 head purebred Angus operation focused on providing superior seedstock to progressive cattlemen. CAM Ranches is the culmination of having been raised in a family with deep long-term roots in the American Angus Association and utilizes the most current research available to more accurately manage day-to-day operation of the cowherd. Reproductive strategies include a total AI breeding philosophy and an extensive embryo transfer program resulting in close to 100 pregnancies annually. CAM Ranches participates in an annual production sale with Ogeechee Angus Farm in Wadley, Ga., the first Saturday of May. Andrew was selected to the 2009 class of the Beef Leaders Institute, through AAA, which is designed to cultivate leaders in the beef industry while enhancing understanding of the total beef production system. Andrew has been on the GAA Board of Directors for the past four years. During this time, he has served on several committees including Membership and Promotion. Along with AAA and GAA, Andrew is also a member GCA and is employed by VitaFerm as an Area Sales Manager for Georgia and Florida. Andrew and his wife, Julie, have two children, Naomi (3) and Charles Aubrey (Cam, 7 mos).



Melvin Porter of Jefferson has raised Angus cattle all of his life. He and his wife Donna own and operate Meldon Farms. The Porters have been very instrumental with the Georgia Junior Angus Association in making it one of the most outstanding junior associations in the country, including serving as the chairpersons of the 1997 NJAS. They have been honored as the National Junior Angus Advisors of the Year and have received the GAA Family of the Year award. Melvin has served as President, Vice President and Director for GAA and serves on various committees for the association. Melvin and Donna have two children, Hutch and Allison, that were actively involved with Angus programs on the state and national levels during their youth. Melvin is a member of the Jackson County Cattleman's Association and currently serving as president elect of the GCA.

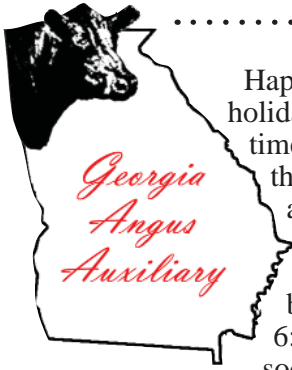

North and South Carolina Junior Angus to host 2014 Eastern Regional

The North and South Carolina Junior Angus Associations will be hosting the 2014 Eastern Regional Junior Angus Show June 13-15, 2014 in Raleigh, N.C. This is the second largest individual cattle breed show in the U.S., second only to the National Junior Angus Show. They are expecting over 250 farm families, representing eighteen Eastern states to be in attendance.
